#### Message from Mrs Walker – Executive Head teacher

I have thoroughly enjoyed spending time this week with pupils from all classes, either visiting lessons or in pupil voice sessions with small groups, sharing their learning and workbooks. Maths was the focus on Tuesday: in Reception and Nursery, pupils were having lots of fun with their learning about shapes and how they can be rotated to fit together and make other shapes and patterns, while Year 1 and 2 pupils were practising their ability to use and order the days of the week and telling the time. It was great to hear how confident all pupils were when talking about their Maths, including recalling past learning and making connections, such as using their knowledge of fractions and the 5x table to help tell the time. On Wednesday, we had a monitoring visit from our YCAT CEO, Mrs Robinson, and together we visited a **Geography** lesson in Class 2, where we were very impressed by all pupils' ability to quickly grasp new learning about the features of rivers. we were equally impressed by the depth of Geographical knowledge shared with us in our discussions with pupils from Year 1 to 6, covering topics ranging from the countries and capitals of the UK, the world's continents and oceans, Uganda, the equator and weather (Y1/2), to UK regions, the water cycle and rivers (Y3/4) and Brazil (Y5/6). Art was also a focus for discussion with other groups from Year 1 to 4 and again, we found all pupils able to explain their exciting learning journeys in detail and with such enthusiasm as they showed off the quality work building up over the year in their sketch books. Mrs Robinson, who visits so many schools in her role across YCAT and as an Ofsted inspector, gave our pupils high praise as some of the best she has heard in their ability to talk about their learning. A huge well done to every pupil involved – we are very proud of you! - and to all staff for their ongoing dedicated work to teach and support across the curriculum. Have a well-deserved, wonderful half term holiday all!
