<u>School Uniform-reminder</u> <u>The correct uniform is:</u>

Navy blue Hawes Primary School sweatshirt

Hawes School polo shirt in house colours

Navy or plain black trousers/shorts or skirts. Shorts should be trouser shorts(appropriate length) – not sports shorts / cycling shorts. House coloured checked gingham dresses may be worn in summer.
