NOT FROM THE VICARAGE – A view from a Pew

As every reader is bound to notice or already know Dave and Sarah are on holiday. I was asked to write something in the optimistic hope that it would be better than a blank page. All of us in Upper Wensleydale must share the view that few people deserve a holiday more than Dave and Sarah.

During all the events of Holy Week the prospect of a two-week break must have helped to keep them going. When holidays were a lifeline for me – about twenty years ago – I thought that all decent holidays fell into three parts. Part one was shaking off all the things that had absorbed your time and energy leading up to the break. Part three was beginning to think about the challenges you would face when the holiday came to an end. Part two, the middle of the time away, was the whole point of the holiday when you were free from the stress of what you had been doing and hadn't begun to be tempted into thinking of what you were going back to. I suggest that we should all pray that "Part two" takes up much the greater part of Dave and Sarah's holiday.

Worthwhile breaks don't all have to be long. A couple of months ago Ann bundled me into our car for one night and half a day on Lindisfarne. If you have never been or last went like us many years ago, I strongly recommend it. We didn't go to the castle but found lots to absorb us in the monastic ruins, the church, the visitor centre and the immediate landscape. It's not history for the sake of it. It is all about the introduction of the Christian faith to our part of England, It is hard not to be inspired and challenged by the lives of Cuthbert and others. Coping with the limited times for visiting and leaving Lindisfarne gave us time to spend a few hours in Berwick on Tweed. It has one of the very few churches in England (and it is just in England!) built during the Civil War. Oliver Cromwell looked in and gave various architectural instructions. After 1660 they took rather less notice of him.

It is not immediately relevant to our Benefice, but it seems right to mention that we now have no head of the Roman Catholic Church and no head of the Anglican Communion. The two roles are very different, of course. The Archbishop of Canterbury is responsible for a diocese, for a province (the southern half of England), for a country (England) and for the worldwide Anglican Communion. The successor to Pope Francis will have the worldwide role but not an equivalent of Canterbury's more specific responsibilities. I am not sure that that difference entirely justifies the time that it will take for a man or woman to be appointed to succeed Justin Welby. He resigned on 12 November 2024. It may be a year or more after that before we know the name of the next archbishop. It is quite likely that we will know the name of the next Pope in less than a month's time.
