Attendees do not need to register, they simply click on the link at the above time to access the session. **Cameras and voice/audio will be switched off for all attendees.** Attendees can ask questions by typing in the Q&A box, but this will be explained during the session.

The event will be streamed using Teams. Attendees can watch the live event in:

- **Teams app—desktop (Windows or Mac) or mobile.** (The Teams app is free to download if attendees would like to do that beforehand).

- As a reminder, this session (and all our virtual sessions) will be recorded and will be subsequently shared so if somebody can't make the live session then they can watch it back at a time that is convenient to them.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

As a school we cannot emphasise enough the importance of good attendance in school and especially this term with assessments and preparations for the next academic year being crucial. After the Autumn and Spring Terms (Overall attendance 95.%), where we had a continued number of illnesses. We are working closely on monitoring our attendance across the school and have held meetings with some parents around attendance .

Through our close work within YCAT, we aim for our whole school attendance to be at least over 96%. If you need any support with your child/children around either attendance, or lateness issues, please get in touch with the school to arrange a meeting with class teachers, Mrs. Marwood or Miss Caygill, so we can work together to improve the attendance and learning of your child/children alongside the learning for other children in school.

As the Summer Term starts we continue to have a growing number of parents taking children out of school on family holidays. Taking a pupil on leave during term time interrupts teaching and learning and can disrupt educational progress for all children.

Please note that penalty notices will be issued to parents/carers for unauthorised absence during this academic school year. See information below from NYES-Published July 2024

Penalty Notices for unauthorised leave of absence taken in term time:

From the 19th of August 2024 only 2 Penalty Notices can be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within a 3 year rolling period and any 2nd Penalty Notice issued within that period is charged at a higher rate:

- The first Fixed Penalty Notice issued to a parent in respect of a particular child will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days, this will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second Fixed Penalty Notice issued to the same parent in respect of the same child will be charged a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.
- A third Fixed Penalty Notice cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the date of issue of the first Penalty Notice.
- In a case where the national threshold is met for the third time (or subsequent times) alternative action should be taken instead. This will often include considering Prosecution but may include

other tools such as one of the other Attendance Legal Interventions.

Medical Appointments

Please try to arrange medical appointments out of school time if possible.

We will be requesting confirmation of medical appointments etc. if they are scheduled within school time. We would be grateful for your support in ensuring your child/children attends school regularly in line with the government regulations.


Stem Day Settlebeck

Richmond Swimming Pool

Richmond pool have been experiencing problems with the ceiling above the swimming pools at Active North Yorkshire Richmond, which necessitated the closure of both pools last week.

This is essential so that we can provide you with a safe and reliable facility. We will not be able to reopen the pools until after works have been planned and carried out, which we expect to run into the summer. We apologise for the disruption this will cause.
