Ukulele Performance

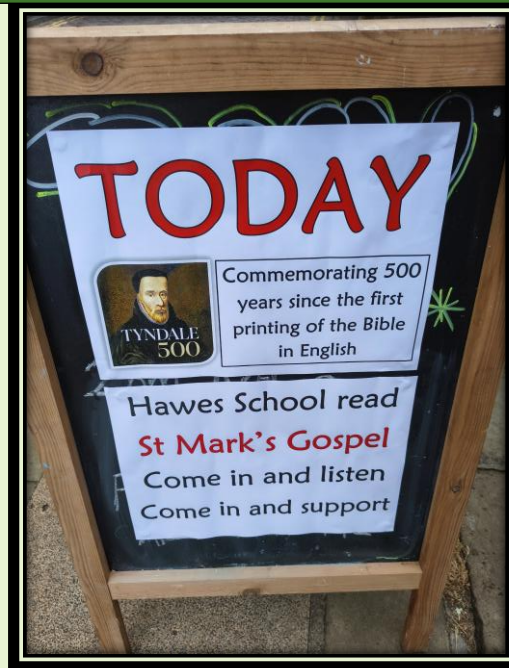
