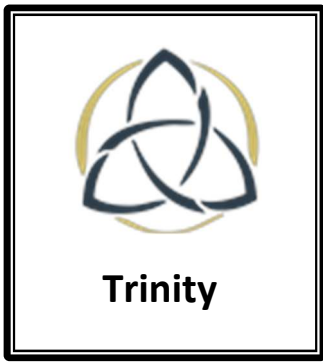

Do not be afraid!

It is striking how often that phrase appears in the Bible. It is usually the first thing angels say when they meet the people they visit. Fear is a deeply human emotion, and we are very good at feeling it. We like routine and certainty, and anything unfamiliar or beyond our control can easily make us anxious.

If you asked an older person what most often robbed them of joy, I suspect they would say it was worrying about things that never happened. We spend so much time and energy on needless anxiety because we expect the worst, whether in our leisure, work, or spiritual lives.

Here in Upper Wensleydale, we are now stepping into the unknown. With Rev Dave retiring on 30th August, it falls to all of us to keep the Benefice running. For me, working in the office, this means taking on more responsibility without Dave nearby to answer questions.

For the churchwardens, it brings greater responsibility and a bigger time commitment. For our retired clergy—Rev Vera, Bill, and Steve—it means extra work too, alongside our brilliant and willing lay leadership team. Others in our congregations will also take on new roles, including home visiting, schools work, and hospital visiting.

Dave has prepared us well for these roles, and we can step into them with confidence, knowing that God is with us. I will not pretend it is not daunting—because it is—but we must never let fear prevent us from doing what we know is right.

Nor will I pretend it will feel the same as when Dave was here. Even so, everything already in place will continue: the work of God's kingdom does not, and will not, stop.

We know you will support and pray for us, just as we will support and pray for you. We look ahead with confidence to where God is leading us. We are here for our wider community and if you need prayer, a visit or some other help, or know someone who does, please continue to contact your church, because we remain committed to you.

So as we begin this new chapter, let us do so not with fear, but with faith: trusting that God has already gone ahead of us, that He will equip us for what He asks of us, and that together we will continue to serve, grow, and bear witness to His love in this special place.
