#### Message from Mrs. Walker - Executive Head teacher

This week it has been great to visit lessons across school and talk to pupils about their learning in **Writing** (Class 2) and **Maths** (pupil groups from all classes and lessons in Classes 1 and 3). For the Maths visits, I shared the monitoring with Miss Thistlethwaite, our Maths subject leader and our Chair of Governors, Abbie Rhodes. As usual, we were very impressed by how quickly pupils are grasping new learning and are confident to talk about their work. In Class 2, pupils were enjoying writing persuasive arguments about protecting the rainforest; their writing showed some effective use and understanding of imperative verbs, 'cause and effect' conjunctions and paragraphs and was certainly very persuasive! In their Maths, Class 1 pupils were building their skills of measuring and reading scales; in Class 4, pupils demonstrated good ability to simplify fractions. All pupils we spoke to were very enthusiastic about their Writing and Maths and were able to recall lots of prior learning from work across the year. It was lovely to hear how much our pupils enjoy these subjects and how they know that practice and recalls help them to develop fluency and automaticity. Well done everyone!
