Staff changes

Early Reading in school

On Tuesday, I very much enjoyed spending part of my morning visiting **Class 1** to see **Phonics** learning in action! Our Reception pupils were all so engaged in their lesson and demonstrated lots of confidence both recalling prior learning and building knowledge of new letters, sounds and blending to read words. The new letter 'j' was very popular! It was also a real joy to hear the progress being made by a group of **pupils from Years 1, 2 and 3** as I listened to them read to their Teaching Assistants, who were very ably supporting them to build fluency – well done everyone!
